Case Study— Pupil Premium—Context

Pupil Premium Funding
The school received £254455 of Pupil Premium Funding.
Currently, 177 Pupils are eligible for Pupil Premium Funding.

Disadvantaged Pupils Cohort
There are currently 44% DP pupils in the school.
One of these pupils is an identified Looked After Child.

Specific Challenges Faced by the Disadvantaged Pupils Cohort
Index of Multiple Deprivation demonstrates that school falls into one of the most deprived areas in the country for:
Employment (70%+ IMD Band A)
Health and Disability (70%+ IMD Band A)
More than half of the pupils in each year group fall into IMD Band B, with an increased number falling into IMD Band A (most deprived in country).
