

Commitment


• Nurses are committed to improving techniques and ways of working to ensure the best outcomes for patients. They strive to be the best nurse they can be.

Individual Liberty


I am responsible for my actions. It is important to remember they can have an impact on people, places and things. We can choose actions that can help both ourselves and others.


