Our Sports Premium allowance for the academic year 2024-2025 is £19,062. Our Sports Premium will be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements for the provision of PE and Sport, and to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. The Department for Education's vision for the Primary PE and Sports Premium is that ALL pupils leaving primary school should be physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport. We work in partnership with Go Well, previously Sedgefield Sports Partnership, to provide high quality coaching for our children, also ongoing support for all our staff.

We have identified the following five areas for further development against the following 5 Key Indicators:

- 1. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and Sport.
- 2. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school.
- 3. The profile of PE and Sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sporting activities offered to all pupils.
- 5. Increased pupil participation in competitive sport.
